
Chap 6:1-14



Where have we been so far?

- Greeting and Introduction of the Gospel
- •Indictment of all mankind all have sinned
- •Law reveals, defines, increases faith saves
- Faith: to take God at His word and obey
- Past secures the future & guides our present
- Choose to be connected to Christ now

Romans 5:20-21

The law was brought in so that the trespass might increase. But where sin increased, grace increased all the more, ²¹ so that... grace might reign...to bring eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Paul's conclusion opens him up to critique

Paul employs diatribe – questioning attack

•6:1-14 & 6:15-23 — "What then..."

- Indicative / imperative construction
 - •Indicative statement of truth
 - •Imperative command
- "Do this & don't do that" versus "faith"?

Romans 6:1-2

"What a ghastly thought!"

What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? ² By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it?

- Justified persons no longer live a life of sin
 - Do we sin? Yes, but selfishness no longer dominates how we make decisions

Paul's indicative

³ Do you not know that all of us who have been <u>baptized</u> into Christ Jesus were <u>baptized</u> into his death?

- •What baptism are we talking about?
 - •1 Cor 12:13 & Eph 1:13-14

Paul answers his question

⁴ We were <u>buried</u> therefore with him by baptism <u>into death</u>, in order that, just as Christ was <u>raised from the dead</u> by the glory of the Father, we too might <u>walk in newness</u> <u>of life</u>.

Death & burial linked to resurrection & life

55 For <u>if</u> we have been <u>united</u> with Him <u>in a</u> <u>death</u> like His, we shall certainly be <u>united</u> with him <u>in a resurrection</u> like His.

- •If united in death, then also in resurrection
 - Indicative / imperative logic
 - •πίστης (pistis) "believe" / "faith"

Romans 6:6-7 Death connection amplified

⁶ We know our old self was crucified...<u>so that</u> we would no longer be enslaved to sin. For one who has died has been set free from sin.

- Based upon the fact we died, we "know"
 - Paul will use an illustration in chap 7

Life connection amplified

⁸ Now <u>if</u> we have died with Christ, we <u>believe</u> that we will also live with Him.

- Paul is transitioning to application
 - •If we "know" we have died, we "believe"
 - •Is this future belief or present belief?

Support of v8

⁹ We <u>know</u> that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; <u>death no longer has dominion over him</u>. ¹⁰ For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but <u>the life he lives he lives to God</u>.

•(v8) We died w/Him, so we will live w/Him

Paul's imperative

11 So you also must <u>consider</u> yourselves <u>dead</u> to <u>sin</u> and <u>alive to God</u> in Christ Jesus.

- Changes to the <u>present imperative</u> plural
 - Reckon / consider / meditate on
 - •Keep on reminding yourself Rom 12:2

- ¹² Let not sin <u>therefore</u> reign in your mortal body, to make you obey its passions.
- Based on the <u>fact</u> you are dead to sin and alive to God...act in accordingly – "believe"

13 Do not present your members to sin as instruments for unrighteousness, but <u>present yourselves to God</u> ...and your members to God as instruments for righteousness.

•Completely dedicate yourself – Rom 12:1

- ¹⁴ For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are <u>not under law but under grace</u>.
- Why? Dead to sin (v 11)
 - No longer related to Adam (chap 7)
- How? Alive to God (v 11)
 - Power of the Holy Spirit (chap 8)

Summary

- •Shall we go on sinning? No!
 - We were baptized into His death
 - •We will be raised as He was into life
 - We are no longer under Sin and Death
 - We are under Life and Righteousness
- Believing that, live

The Gospel

Know, believe, reckon! Sin is not your master



ROMANS GOSPEL-ROOTED LIVING



"Died to sin"

- Legal no longer related to sin
- Baptismal affirm what God has done
- Moral daily die to self / the flesh
- Eschatological no longer in the presence

Water baptism is individual and corporate

- Baptized's perspective:
 - •Sign of the outward ratification of the human decision of faith "I am His"
- •Church's perspective:
 - •Sign God has applied the benefit of Christ's work to the individual "S/He is one of us"

Water baptism in Paul's time

- No such thing of an unbaptized believer
- No such thing as a baptized unbeliever
 - Invited persecution and condemnation
- Baptism is a demarcation btwn someone who is a believer and someone who is not
 - •How you & we know who is in the church
